During the 2 years at home with the children I kept contact with Ilona, and I saw how God is leading the work, and bringing about the real goal what we dream for HANNAH. Children need to be near their parents, in their community. Now that I became a mother, I feel much stronger what it means to have my children nearby me, and how important is for the children to be next to

their parents. Now I come back and I work with families. For me is a new field, I learn about social work in families, but now is the first opportunity to put in practice what I learnt during the university, and in New Zealand. What has been happening in the past few months?

Kati has now been back at work for 3 months and taken on the new work of HANNAH in the community with faith and energy. It is wonderful to have Kati back and to be able to build on the great work that Ilona did keeping in contact with the children when they first

returned to their communities. Kati is continuing to work part time for HANNAH and part time for Christian Endeavour.

Working alongside the families of the children who were returned to their families and communities when the institution was closed last year due covid-19, also

now includes the siblings of these children who had remained at home, and the people who care for the children. This work is intensive and focussed on the children's and their family's needs and building up networks within the community.

What has this work entailed over the past few months?

- Building relationships of trust with the all families of the children.
- Organising alternative care for a child who is unable to be cared for at home at the present moment. Working with the mother and stepfather so they can have the children home in the future.
- Locating ID papers for children so they can attend school.
- Assisting families to obtain the necessary paper work to access health care, legal services, government services.

HANNAH works in Romania to bring Hope and Nurture to children and families who struggle to care for their own. The work currently centres around children living in institutional care while building links with their families and communities.
